




# AN EXPLORER'S GUIDE TO NORTH BAY ONTARIO

North Bay might be Northern Ontario's most accessible city, with six different border crossings available to residents of Buffalo, Detroit, New York City, Boston and Chicago. A mere 3 1/2 hour drive from Toronto, North Bay is a popular year-round travel destination, offering a multitude of activities and experiences.

With a great assortment of attractions, cultural facilities, events, restaurants, hotels and more, North Bay is one of Northern Ontario's most sought after destinations.



## HISTORY

North Bay was incorporated as a town in 1891. The construction of the Northern Ontario Railway resulted in the discovery of silver deposits just north of the city, and the ensuing formation of the Canadian Northern Railway in 1913 made North Bay the railway hub for Northern Ontario.

The city's location made it the Gateway to the North with the northern mining boom and a robust lumbering sector. Today, North Bay is the link to the north, south, east and west for transportation and communication activities. These connections to other markets have spurred the Northern Ontario city's growth for now and into the future.



## CHIEF COMMANDA II

This 320-passenger vessel is equipped with two bars, open-air BBQ, and features live entertainment every Sunday in July and August. The “Chief” features three decks, with the main and second deck areas enclosed complete with outside viewing areas. Enjoy a dining sightseeing or music cruise, or charter your own private voyage.

## CALLANDAR BAY HERITAGE MUSEUM

Located in the former home of Dr. Allan Roy Dafoe, physician to the famed Dionne Quintuplets, the Callandar Bay Heritage Museum features items of the sisters, the Doctor’s practice, and an old-fashioned barbershop. You can also see other artifacts that give insight into the city’s shipping and logging history, and the jersey of two-time Stanley Cup Champion, Bill Barber.



## DISCOVERY NORTH BAY MUSEUM

Discovery North Bay Museum is open year-round, offering interactive exhibits, programs, and events. Located in the historic Canadian Pacific Railway Station, the museum also hosts travelling exhibits from museums across Canada.




## LAURENTIAN SKI HILL

North Bay's Laurentian Ski Hill features a 300-foot vertical, six runs and three lifts. Suitable for the entire family, it's North Bay's favourite alpine adventure destination.

## DUCHESNAY FALLS

Located west of North Bay along Highway 17, Duchesnay Falls' long cascade consists of several drops, twists and turns. There's an easily accessible trail to explore this natural wonder. Whether you hike, walk or check out the local wildlife, it's a must-see when visiting North Bay.



## KATE PACE WAY

Named after Olympic skier Kate Pace, this 7.5 mile/12km multi-use trail is a great way to explore North Bay. Whether it's a brisk walk, jog, bike ride or inline skating, there's lots to see and do for everyone.


## CULTURE DAYS
