

TRIP IDEAS

Nestled on the shores of the St. Marys River, Sault Ste. Marie, is the third largest city in Northern Ontario and home to some great sights and attractions. Let's take a tour, shall we?

DAY 1 – SAULT SEEING

1 CANADIAN BUSHPLANE HERITAGE CENTRE

After a hearty breakfast, our first stop is the Canadian Bushplane Heritage Centre. One of Sault Ste. Marie's most popular attractions, this historic waterfront hangar features over 30 aircraft displays, two theatres, flight simulators, interactive children's activities and guided group tours.

2 ERMATINGER•CLERGUE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

From there, it's just a hop, skip and a jump to the Ermatinger-Clergue National Historic Site, a year-round cultural attraction that includes an interactive Heritage Discovery Centre and two of the oldest stone buildings in the province—the Ermatinger Old Stone House and the Clergue Blockhouse.

3 ART GALLERY OF ALGOMA

Next, we continue west to the Art Gallery Of Algoma. With a permanent collection of over 5,000 works of art and 24 unique exhibitions every year, it's a haven for art-lovers. Discover Canada's masterpieces, including some original works from Canada's renowned Group of Seven, or paint your own with art instruction and hands-on workshops.

4 WHITEFISH ISLAND/ PARKS CANADA - SAULT STE. MARIE CANAL

After lunch, continue west along the boardwalk until you find the bridge to Whitefish Island. Fish the rapids, explore the rich history of the Batchewana First Nation or hike to the observation deck for a bird's eye view of the St. Marys River. And don't forget to explore the historic Sault Ste. Marie Canal, which was the first electric lift lock in the world.

DAY 2 – ALL ABOARD!

5 AGAWA CANYON TOUR TRAIN

For your second day of adventure in the Sault, we're riding the rails on the fabled Agawa Canyon Tour Train, one of Northern Ontario's most famous attractions. Departing from downtown Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, Canada, you'll never forget your 114 miles/183km journey that showcases the rugged and ancient beauty of Sault Ste. Marie and Algoma Country.
