DAY 1 – DOWN BY THE BAY

1 WATERFRONT SHOPPING

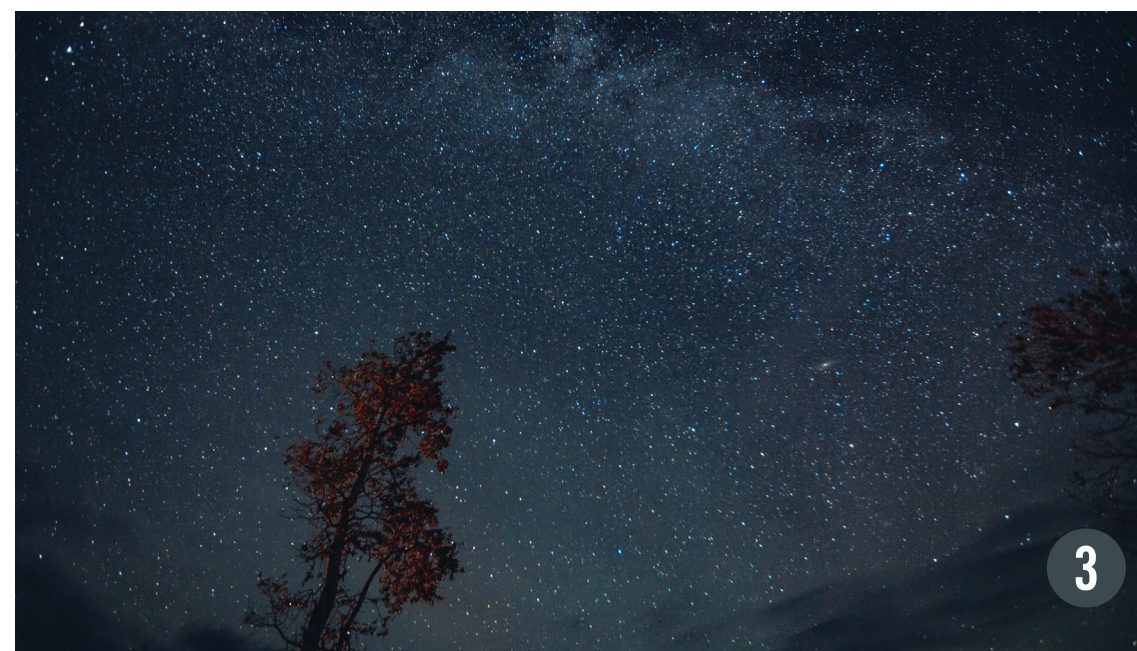
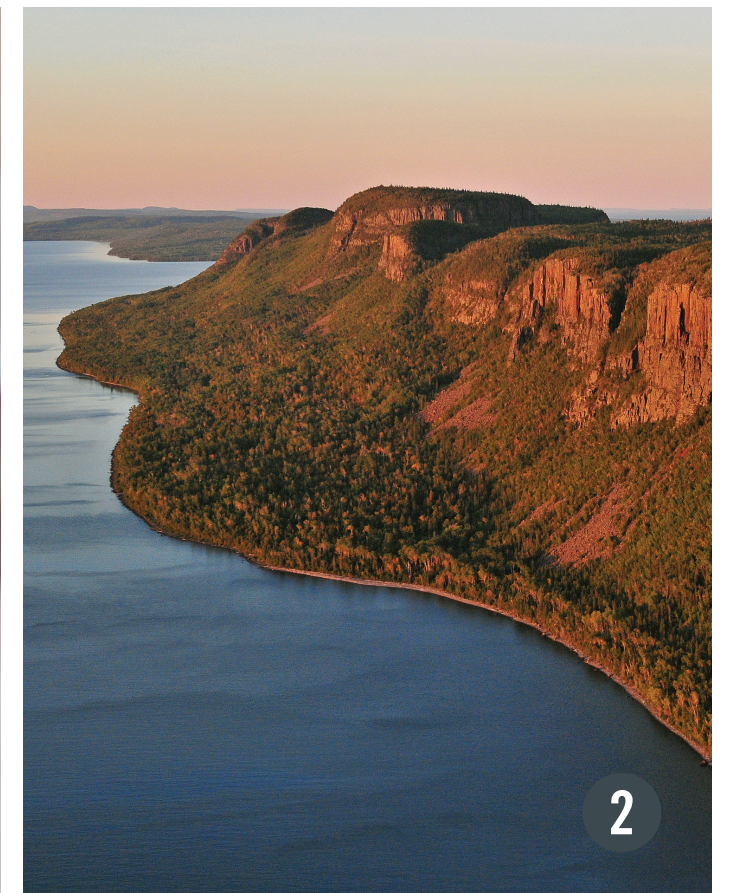
Whether you're shopping for a gift or treating yourself, Thunder Bay's waterfront is replete with unique shops and boutiques, featuring everything from the latest fashions to local crafts that you won't find anywhere else.

2 GET A BIRD'S EYE VIEW OF THE BAY

Departing right from downtown Thunder Bay, Wilderness North Aerial Tours is a great way to get the lay of the land. Soar high above the city and countryside onboard a legendary DeHavilland Otter as you explore Lake Superior and landmarks surrounding Thunder Bay. It's a truly unique tour.

3 STARGAZING IN STYLE

You've looked down at the city on an aerial tour; now look up at the stars with an evening visit to the Thunder Bay Observatory. There are lots of private tour options as low as \$2 per person, depending on your group size. On a moonless clear night, it's possible to see objects 150,000 times fainter than the human eye can see!



DAY 2 – NATURE AND CULTURE

4 SLEEPING GIANT

Thunder Bay's 50-million-ton mascot, Sleeping Giant, is a must on your visit. Composed of mesas and sills, Sleeping Giant is a rock formation resembling a reclining giant. You can view it from the city, or visit Sleeping Giant Provincial Park for dramatic panoramic views, hiking, biking, canoeing, kayaking, camping and more.



5 CANADA'S LONGEST SUSPENSION BRIDGE & ZIPLINE

Located along the towering cliffs of Eagle Canyon, just 40 miles/65km from Thunder Bay, you'll find an epic adventure. Challenge one: walk the 600-foot long suspension bridge 150 feet above the canyon floor. Challenge two: fly across the canyon on Canada's longest zipline!

6 IT'S SHOWTIME!

What better way to cap off a wonderful day than with a show? The Magnus Theatre is a favourite playhouse with 40 years of history and a focus on Canadian content. The Thunder Bay Community Auditorium is another great venue, considered one of the finest concert halls in North America.
